on the offensive line. All are likewise outstanding on defense where hard-hitting linebackers Ham-bright (who earned All-American Conference recognition last season) and Klinger present major worries for opposing schools.

Cameron also welcomes a batch of newcomers, including speedsters Caleb Gehman and Ryan Combs. Adam Zerby and Brody Hetrick will be key additions to the offensive and defensive lines.

“Both Combs and Gehman did not play last year,” Cameron said. “They are really good athletes.”

Add the intangibles of heart and character into the mix and this could be a magical season at East Juniata.

“We’re not going to be a power team that rams the ball down someone’s

throat,” Cameron said. “But I cannot speak high enough for the character of this team. Our strength is the commitment that the players are starting to show toward one another. They trust each of their teammates to do their jobs and are sticking to their assignments. It’s a family.”

Cameron may have moved up to a new position, but he definitely knows his players, having been the coach of the junior high program. Before that, he spent six seasons as the varsity defensive coordinator.

“The kids want to win and are learning what it takes to win,” he said. “Realistically, our goal is to finish .500 or better and compete in all games. My expectations are simply that every player improves and learns throughout the season, that they commit themselves to the team, and always give it their best.

“If these things happen, we will be able to be suc-

cessful this year.”

That will be a challenge in the rugged TVL.

“We are in a tougher league this year and my players understand that,” Cameron said. “Line Mountain, Millersburg, Juniata returning from the Mountain League; I could say something positive about every team in the TVL. They have all had success at winning at some point in their school’s history. We just need to stay focused on the team we will be playing.”

While thanking his wife for allowing him the time to coach, Cameron also approached a factor that makes every sport at East Juniata a challenge — funding.

“Juniata County is strict pay to play and we must sustain our own programs,” he said. “I thank the parents of the players and the Tiger QB Club for their support and funding. Without their help, football at our school would not exist.”


