thought it would be," said Fiscus, whose team sported a .375 average last season. "I think we can hit with anybody. Our fielding will be fine. We haven't done a whole lot of pitching. I think we'll be OK there."

Mount Union will rely on a healthy Guiliane. Until she returns, Aurand and Fegley may get the starting nod, along with Morrow and Shugarts.

"Our pitching is untested, but I'm not sure I'd characterize it as a weakness," Fiscus said. "We have some depth and some good leadership. We're pretty posi-

tive about things right now, and I think we're sitting in a good situation."

That should mean that Mount Union will be in the mix for an Inter-County Conference title. Fiscus also believes Bellwood-Antis and Claysburg-Kimmel will provide some stiff competition.

"Just about everyone lost their starting pitcher," Fiscus said. "Pitching-wise, we'll have to see where we are at ... We talked about not being satisfied with winning. It's not just about winning, but we want to play well everyday."




